1. The lake is above, water below; the lake is **empty, dried** up. (1)

Above CHEN THE AROUSING, THUNDER

Below K'AN THE ABYSMAL, WATER

Here the movement **goes out of** the sphere of danger.

- The obstacle has been **removed**,
